REPORT OF THE ANNUAL CONFERENCE MINUTES

GLD Conference Business Meeting | October 14, 2024 | Compass Church, Wheaton

- 1. Welcome and introduction. Chairman Carlan Bounds called the meeting to order. He opened with Ephesians 1:22-23 and talked about how this is a unique year for the District.
- 2. Vice Secretary Gary Ridley reported on the conference delegates.

98 GLD Ministers

21 Lay delegates

1 Affiliate

11 GLD Board members

14 GLD staff members

23 Exhibitors (not eligible to vote)

73 Conferees (not eligible to vote)

Total: 251 Present at the Conference, 145 voting members.

The conference ratified these delegates to be the voting body for today's meeting. M-S-C.

- 3. Gary reported that GLD Board approved the minutes from the 2023 GLD Conference at the December 2023 Board meeting.
- 4. District Superintendent report from Rick Thompson.

Carlan referenced Psalm 4:3 and spoke in appreciation of Rick Thompson's ministry, including regionalization.

Rick spoke on his history in joining the GLD as Superintendent. He highlighted three people. (1) His mother, Ruth Thompson, prayed that Rick would be able to come back to serve in Chicago. (2) Spence Sawyer, former GLD chairman, went to lunch monthly to listen and share. (3) Rick is also grateful for Knute Larson joining team and his ongoing service.

Rick noted three organizational blessings of his time.

- (1) Putting together regional conferences. Rick sought to make sure we always preached the Word, and he organized these with the goal of having at least one non-white speaker at each conference.
- (2) Resilient Ministry with Donald Guthrie. This included about 50 couples doing pastor-wife retreats.
- (3) Regionalization. The original vision developed and matured over time.

Rick gave his top reason for hope: Affirming Brett Gleason as the next superintendent. Rick expressed confidence in growth and the advance of the mission of the GLD. Brett brings three things:

- (1) Perspective. Brett is able to see beyond a single church. He has been serving at the district level for years, with good understanding of this.
- (2) Proven faithfulness. Brett has been faithful, showing effective oversight without being overbearing.
- (3) Personal. Brett is friendly and relational, taking initiative to engage people.

Three churches to remove from membership. M-S-C.

- Brookside Church, Bowling Green, OH (closed)
- Restore Church, Detroit, MI (withdrew)

- Loraine Church of Henry County, Prophetstown, IL. Mark Balmer introduced and recommended for membership. Ted Blean spoke on behalf of Loraine Church. M-S-C.

6. Financial Report and Budget

2024 Financial Report.

Bob Blahnik expressed thanks to Rick Thompson and Brett Gleason. Encouraged churches to lead churches to 1.25% giving.

Brett Gleason gave overview of financial picture, with thanks to Matthew Mathai for his years of accounting work.

Brett reported a strong ministry fund unrestricted balance of \$160,633. Total Ministry Fund balance \$247,181. Church Planting fund of \$745,683. Capital fund includes a building held in trust. Brett reported strong church contributions: \$367,600.

For expenses, Brett noted that compensation is slightly over budget, primarily due to health insurance numbers increasing. Ministry expenses were higher due to increased travel. This has led to a minimal deficit.

Motion to accept report. M-S-C.

2025 Budget. Reported using historical data for budgeted church contributions. Staff Development is higher because of EFCA One, since we cover staff costs to attend. Legal and Accounting is up because 2025 is an audit year.

Motion to approve 2025 budget. M-S-C.

7. GLD Bylaws changes—second reading.

Section II—GLD Conference Affiliated Organizations. Carlan introduced the proposed changes and opened for questions.

Motion to take motion off table to vote. M-S-C.

Motion to approve changes to bylaws. M-S-C.

8. GLD Bylaws changes—first reading.

Section V—Succession. Carlan introduced proposed changes. To summarize this change, it will enable those serving in a vice position to be able to step into the primary positions without having to have less than the option to serve up to three two-year terms. It provides good transition when someone serving in a Vice position is able to move to the primary. Carlan opened for guestions.

Motion to table motion. M-S-C.

9. Q&A with Rick Thompson and Brett Gleason. Joey Woestman introduced session.

Joey asked Rick about his calling to be GLD Superintendent. Rick referenced Erwin Lutzer's definition: a call is inner conviction of Holy Spirit confirmed by Word of God and church. That was affirmed for him in 2004.

What did it mean to be successful DS 20 years ago? Rick: There were three goals: (1) No pastor left alone (shepherds to the shepherds)—goal of 80% engaged; (2) Consultants to the churches; (3) Catalysts of multiplication.

How has success for DS changed? Rick: Before regular cell phone usage, there was much more travel. Part of future is figuring out how to multiply ministry via Zoom and other technologies.

What do you see in Brett that you wish you could have brought to able? Rick: Brett has the gift of leadership and organization/administration. One thing he will bring to the next chapter is drilling down on the detail level.

To Brett: What have you learned about your time working with Rick? Brett: First and foremost, to be faithful to God's Word and to live your life with moral integrity. Paul says: watch your life and doctrine closely. Rick has modeled that. The first job is to be a disciple-maker at home. Second is commitment to building a healthy board and staff team. We need to be moving in the same direction together.

To both: what do you think the DS needs to be able to do because of what we are facing in the culture around us as we look ahead? Rick: The list of topics for EFCA One is telling: gender issues, living as exiles in foreign culture, how to be technologically advanced. These are big.

To Brett: How do you hope the GLD grows and matures under your leadership? Brett: In the 1990s, the cultural moment was about finding common ground and moving forward together. That fit the EFCA model. It is different now: finding who is in my tribe and how to defeat the other side. What do we do with who we are as the free church in this climate? Things like the significance of silence and being a church of all believers but believers only. We need to lean into these distinctives, not away from them. Trust in the power of the Gospel uniting and finding community.

If you are the DS, how do you help us lean into that? Brett: One faith, one family, one mission. We need to strengthen our churches' connection to the Statement of Faith and to each other. What does it mean for us to be a family of churches? We need to reach out and care for those who are hurting, to lean into the Acts 1:8 mission.

10. Elections

Carlan introduced the Board recommendation for Superintendent. Carlan noted many hours of prayer and work preparing for this transition. The GLD Board of Directors recommends to the GLD Brett Gleason to serve as the next District Superintendent. By paper ballot: 117 yes, 2 no.

PROPOSED CHANGES TO GLD ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

Below are two proposed amendments to the bylaws for your review and consideration for this year's annual conference.

The first proposed amendment is the first reading. It deals with the mechanism for removing churches who request to be removed either because they are leaving the EFCA or they are closing. This will be the first reading of this proposed amendment, and we will vote on it in 2026.

The second proposed amendment is the second reading. It deals with term limits of those serving as Executive Directors in the GLD. Executive Directors include the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Treasurer, Vice-Treasurer, Secretary, and Vice-Secretary. If someone serving as Vice-Chairman, Vice-Treasurer, or Vice-Secretary is nominated and approved to serve as Chairman, Treasurer, or Secretary it resets the term clock and allows them to serve for an additional three full two-year terms for a total of six additional years. The reasoning is that this allows for continuity of leadership while continuing to receive new members into the Board of Directors. As this proposed amendment was read at last year's conference, it will be discussed and voted on at this year's 2025 conference.

FIRST READING

Section I, Article B, Point 2

Current:

If the differences cannot be resolved, the Board of Directors shall accept the request for withdrawal and recommend to the next conference that the church in question be released from Great Lakes District Conference membership

Proposed:

If a church requests removal or has already closed, the Board of Directors is authorized to honor their request or closure and remove the church as a member of the Great Lakes District and the Evangelical Free Church of America. This action will be reported in the conference manual at the next district conference as a matter of information.

SECOND READING

Section V, Article A, Point 4

Current:

Succession: Each director shall hold office until his successor shall have been duly elected and shall have qualified. Executive Directors may serve no more than three (3) consecutive terms. General Directors may serve no more than three (3) consecutive terms

Proposed:

Succession: Each director shall hold office until his successor shall have been duly elected and shall have qualified. General Directors may serve no more than three (3) consecutive terms.

Executive Directors may serve no more than three (3) consecutive terms. For those who served in a vice role during the prior term, their term clock will be reset as they begin the first year of their first term in the position of Chairman, Treasurer, or Secretary.

STAFF REPORTS

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

Brett Gleason

It is my great honor and privilege to serve as your District Superintendent. In 2025, my highest priority was to build stronger relationships with pastors and churches, build systems for ministry health, and lay a foundation for our future together. In all of this, I have been reminded again of God's faithfulness as Christ builds his church.

My top three priorities for this past year are to: (1) Build relational trust and deeper understanding through connecting with pastors, leaders, and churches; (2) Strengthen two ministry systems; and (3) Develop greater organizational clarity for the GLD board and staff moving forward.

Priority One: Connecting with Pastors and Leaders

During this year it was great to meet and connect with pastors and leaders across the Great Lakes District by visiting ministerials and affinity groups, sitting in on credentialing councils, and having shared meals and coffees. I'm thankful for our shared commitment to the Word of God, shepherding God's people, and reaching our neighbors and the nations with the gospel.

Priority Two: Developing Ministry Systems

Building *adaptable* systems are vital to support both health and growth. By collaborating to build systems together, our staff team will be better positioned to develop and implement stronger ministry with more consistency of process and outcomes than if each member of our team does things their own way. At the same time, systems need to be adaptable to meet the needs of different churches, leaders, settings, and staff. If a system is not adaptable it will become brittle and break. At our March staff retreat, we identified two systems to work on strengthening: (1) Ministerials and Affinity Groups and (2) Pastoral Search.

In the GLD, ministerials and affinity groups are the small groups ministry of our district. With the collective experience in the room, our staff team developed a simple one-page document (see next page) to clearly state the purpose of ministerials and affinity groups, the responsibilities of the leader, and the components of the gatherings. This document is a resource for our Superintendent team to work with ministerial leaders to strengthen our ministerial gatherings. Most of our ministerials launched in September with some of them already organizing around this resource. Similarly, we are launching our fall affinity groups at this year's GLD conference with 14 affinity groups in the GLD! I'm super excited as pastors and ministry leaders have an opportunity to connect and build a learning community around their specific ministry role and/or context.

Building Healthy Ministerials and Affinity Groups

The Purpose:

The purpose of our GLD ministerials and affinity groups is to convene pastors and ministry leaders to encourage, equip, and extend.

- We encourage through fellowship and prayer.
- We **equip** through training of ministry and leadership skills.
- We **extend** through evangelism training, developing new leaders, and catalyzing the planting of new congregations (church plants, campuses, and 2nd language congregations).

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

The Leader:

These are the characteristics we believe mark a ministerial or affinity group leader.

- A godly life marked by humility.
- A shepherding leader who cares for the spiritual health of the group members through an emphasis on God's Word and prayer.
- An organizer who with the support of district staff develops a plan for the ministry year, communicates regularly, and follows through on commitments.
- A catalyzer who moves the group towards a shared burden and vision for the planting of new congregations.
- An EFCA credentialed leader who embraces our shared doctrine, mission, and EFCA ethos of "in essentials, unity; in non-essentials, charity; and in all things Jesus Christ."

The Gathering:

Aligned with the purpose, these are some possible elements to include in the scope of a ministry year. A resource library will be curated and developed around these themes.

- Encourage through fellowship and prayer.
 - Sharing a meal together
 - Praying together
 - Fostering deeper relationships for accountability
- Equip through training of ministry and leadership skills.
 - Biblical and Theological development
 - Book studies related to ministry
 - Training for ministry (preaching, discipleship, leadership and strategy)
- Extend through developing new leaders and planting new congregations.
 - Leadership pipeline/pathway training
 - Evangelism training and cohorts
 - Praying for gospel advancement and planting new congregations

Pastoral Search

The second ministry system we tackled is our pastoral search. As I talk with pastors and church leaders, fellow District Superintendents, and search firms everyone says the same thing: "I am struggling to find a candidate to fill a position." This is a critical area that I have experience in first and foremost through my work as Director of Assessment for the EFCA and for work I did for the GLD previously.

I am thankful for the opportunity to work with Steve McCausland as he curated GLD resources as well as best practices in the area. Our pastoral search support is now in beta-form with these Four phases: (1) Consultation with church; (2) Planning for the interim transition period; (3) candidate selection process; and (4) candidate affirmation and onboarding. We also deploy tools for mission and values clarity powered by *Clarity House*, in depth *Mission Insite* demographics study and consultation, and detailed compensation study through churchsalary.com.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

Priority Three: Develop Greater Organizational Clarity

If we don't know where we are going, we will wander aimlessly. This is true in our personal life. It begins with a clear understanding of who we are and the beliefs and values that shape us. For the Christian, our identity is rooted in being a child of God through faith in Christ and our life's purpose and values are shaped by the Holy Scriptures, our family, our church, and even the broader community. From this, we shape our life mission and vocational call. We set personal goals and take ownership of our development. This is but a cursory summary.

Similarly, for an organization it is crucial to understand who we are. To assist in this work, we have partnered with *Clarity House* for the overall process, and our Vice-Chairman Josh Weiland was our facilitator.

During our Family Meeting, I look forward to sharing with you where we are in that process as we develop a strategic plan for our staff team as we serve our district churches, pastors, and leaders.

Ministry Updates

Ministry goals and priorities are important, but then life and ministry happen. I am pleased with the progress we have made, but I recognize there is much work left to be done, and our progress has been slowed by some ministry realities.

I remember this Spring sitting in a coffee shop as I heard with the rest of our District Superintendent team that *Trinity* was closing its Deerfield Campus and moving to Canada. Like many of you, I was sad, shocked, and candidly angry. Since that day, my top priority is to serve the needs of our GLD family of churches and two basic questions emerged: where can we send students and where can we recruit future pastors and leaders from? I look forward to sharing with you the progress we have made at the conference.

At the same time, I want to support *Trinity*. I have two degrees from *TEDS* (MDiv and Dr. of Ministry), so I want *TEDS* to do well. They are still a great option for many of our churches, pastors, and leaders as they consider partners in theological education. At this year's conference, whether you attended *TEDS* or not, I want to encourage you to **attend the Trinity lunch** on Wednesday to receive an update on how they can still continue to serve the EFCA and their efforts to do so.

While our staff team is being proactive in serving churches, a major part of our ministry is responding to situations and offering support to churches as they go through a season of transition or challenge. In general terms, these have included sudden pastoral transitions, working through church conflict, thinking through rapid growth, helping churches in seasons of decline, working through doctrinal issues, and sadly a situation involving moral failure of a pastor.

This summer I was nominated and affirmed at EFCA One to join the Board of Ministerial Standing (BOMS). This is one of two national boards of the EFCA. It is a parallel board to the Board of Directors, meaning that we serve the conference directly. BOMS has the responsibility of overseeing the doctrinal and moral integrity of our credentialed EFCA pastors and leaders. The board sets policy, reviews and approves credentials, and handles the discipline and restoration of credentialed pastors and leaders in the EFCA who committed doctrinal error or moral failure.

DIRECTOR OF HISPANIC MINISTRIES

Ricardo Palmerín

"I tell you, open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest." — John 4:35b, NIV

We give thanks to God for the work He is accomplishing among the Hispanic congregations of the Great Lakes District. The Lord has been consolidating the efforts of past years—planting seeds of the gospel, cultivating committed discipleship, and multiplying ministry in a field that is ready for harvest.

Our Hispanic congregations are composed primarily of immigrants from various Latin American countries, with the majority from Mexico. This represents a significant mission field: in Illinois and Indiana alone, there are approximately 2.5 million Hispanic immigrants—many of whom are ready to hear and respond to the gospel.

Current Challenges

While the potential for multiplication is great, recent months have brought significant challenges. The Latino community has been directly impacted by mass deportation policies enforced by immigration authorities. Many of our congregants live with uncertainty, as enforcement actions have extended beyond those with criminal records or deportation orders to include many Latinos in general, even some with legal residency.

These are times of testing for many brothers and sisters in our churches. So our prayer to the Lord of the Harvest is that He will continue sending workers into His fields—that the gospel of grace will keep being preached, that many will believe in Christ, experience transformed lives, and become instruments of peace and justice in an era when thousands cry out for coherence, authenticity, justice, and the common good in the making and applying of the laws of the land.

Diversity and Multiplication of Congregations

GLD Hispanic churches represent a variety of ministry models: **Immigrant congregations** holding services exclusively in Spanish. **Established churches** incorporating bilingual ministries and services. **English-speaking churches** offering a second service in Spanish or using creative translation methods to communicate God's Word.

There is no single "one-size-fits-all" model for a Hispanic congregation. Each one is shaped by its location, community needs, and ministry context. God simply says about this mission field: "They are ripe for harvest."

We celebrate the progress and consolidation of church plants, Hispanic initiatives and congregation, including *Iglesia de Fe* in Indianapolis, IN; Maywood EFC in Rockford, IL; Multisite Latino congregations at The Compass Church campuses in Bolingbrook and Wheaton, IL; the Hispanic ministry at Galena EFC, Galena, IL. We also see promising opportunities to start new Hispanic congregations in additional areas of northern Indiana and Illinois.

Leadership Development and Training

The Hispanic Leadership Team (HLT) remains committed to walking alongside, mentoring, and provide resources to equipping new Latino leaders and planters. Over the past year, we have offered training through gatherings, in-person meetings, Zoom sessions, ministry cohorts, and retreats—covering topics such as ministry best practices, preaching, discipleship, doctrine, and theological formation.

Last summer, we completed the **GATEWAY** course, providing a strong foundation in theology and ministry practice for a new generation of leaders. And in this fall GLD Conference we are offering a pre-conference training in preaching, and affinity group interaction in Spanish for our Latino leaders.

DIRECTOR OF HISPANIC MINISTRIES

Connection and Encouragement

The HLT continues to partner with Christian organizations to expand ministry impact: **AWANA International** – training in children's and youth ministries; **Meier Clinics** and **White Stone Counseling** – marriage and individual counseling; **World Relief** and **Gospel Justice Center** – immigration and legal services

GLD Latino pastors and their spouses have gathered in spring, and winter for fellowship, encouragement, and relationship building. A pastors-and-wives retreat is scheduled for this coming winter 2026. And regular meetings with pastors and leaders provide time for refreshment, planning, and prayer for one another, for our congregations, and ministry initiatives.

Community Outreach

Our Hispanic congregations engage in a wide variety of summer outreach activities, including Sports tournaments, Vacation Bible School (VBS), Church camps, Baptism services, Immigration legal orientation, and Food pantries among other actions, these events help connect the church with the community while sharing the hope of the gospel.

Prayer and Partnership

"The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field." — Luke 10:2, NIV

We celebrate God's faithfulness and the resilience of our GLD Hispanic congregations in the face of immigration challenges. And the Hispanic Leadership Team expresses deep gratitude for the prayers and partnership of churches, pastors, missionaries, and GLD staff who support Latino pastors and congregations' initiatives. Let us continue to pray for our current Hispanic congregations, and the multiplication of Latino congregations, leaders, and disciples across the GLD.

DIRECTOR FOR WOMEN IN MINISTRY

Thank you for the opportunity to serve the Lord and the GLD churches as I serve women in ministry. The aim of this ministry is to equip, encourage, resource, network, and multiply women leaders in transformational, gospel-centered, disciple-making ministry.

This past year has been both encouraging and fruitful. In April, under the leadership of Brett Gleason and the GLD Board, my role expanded beyond supporting Women's Ministry leaders to include all women serving in staff or lay leadership positions—regardless of ministry area. In May, a survey was conducted to gather valuable insights to guide future opportunities in equipping, networking, mentoring, and resourcing women leaders.

Some highlights from the past year include:

- Developing a 2026 plan focusing on supporting and strengthening women in ministry.
- Continued assisting leaders exploring or implementing a "Scripture as the curriculum" approach for disciple-making ministries.
- Taught at several women's gatherings and led team-building sessions for leadership teams.
- Supported pastors with:
 - Identifying new women leaders
 - Navigating complex ministry situations
 - Strategizing ways to support women leaders in disciple-making ministry
- Equipped and resourced women building counseling ministries.
- Taught on developing women's events that foster assimilation, discipleship, and outreach.
- Shared insights on emerging ministry trends.
- Provided biblical, practical teaching on anxiety.
- Connected leaders for peer learning and collaboration.
- Led three workshops at Moody's International Called Conference on discipling and mobilizing volunteers for sustainable ministry. These were well attended, including many EFCA women.
- Attended EFCA One and met with numerous GLD women leaders.
- Continued serving as a Prepared Coach for the EFCA national office, mentoring several GLD women leaders bi-monthly.
- Continue to serve on the EFCA Board of Directors.

It's been a joy to walk alongside women leaders through one-on-one calls, Zoom meetings, in-person meetings, and email correspondence on specific needs. New leaders are being welcomed, encouraged, equipped, and covered in prayer. Existing leaders are being resourced, supported, and prayed for in areas requiring discernment and care.

Thanks be to God for His faithful shepherding and abundant provision. Thank you, Brett Gleason, the GLD Board, GLD staff, and pastors for the privilege of serving women in ministry. Thank you for your continued prayers for these leaders as they serve Christ in our churches.

This has been a year of transition for me personally and for the broader ministry in Michigan. As I approached retirement at the end of June, I sought to hand-off responsibilities for the facilitation of interdependence through R&D (relational & directional) retreats and gatherings. A cookout gathering at our home in June made it clear that numerous pastors and their wives do see the need and benefits of what has been done. Three pastors accepted the baton of furthering our efforts, even though the format may be different.

Much effort was also spent helping mentor and then lead the ordination councils of three pastors. Each of these men have the capacity to be a multiplier of interdependence that is faithful to God's Word.

While I do not yet have clarity about my future ministry post-retirement, I am leading a pre-conference gathering for "Next-Level Pastors." This will be for men who want the relational and directional support needed to break through the personal and ministry barriers that they face. It is hoped that at least one on-going group is formed, with potentially several being established since they will be capped at 12 members each.

Also at the conference, I will follow-up last year's teaching time on healthy board dynamics with a more workshop-oriented time. While the time at the conference will be a "stand-alone," I will offer to help create a one-year affinity group for those who specifically want to target the development of a healthier board.

REPORT OF THE CHURCH PLANTING COMMISSION

The mission of the EFCA is to multiply transformational churches among all people. We share this commitment to church planting and recognize that we are in a rebuilding phase with church planting. The past few years have been challenging years for church planting. With fewer people going into pastoral ministry, even fewer people are going into church planting.

The EFCA has two teams for church planting. A systems team and a church planter director team. We are thankful that Steve McCausland is now the EFCA's ReachNetwork's Director of Assessment. The GLD hosted our first assessment center in August with one GLD candidate and several other districts participating.

The GLD has decided to similarly take a systems approach to church planting. Steve will serve as our district Director of Assessment, and we are building our coaching and training directors. Lord willing, we will be able to make announcements soon! In terms of recruiting, it is an all-hands-on deck approach.

We have a conviction that churches plant churches and our role is to support those efforts. We believe that church planting needs to be birthed out of prayer. With that in mind, as our ministerials meet to encourage, equip, and extend we will be praying for gospel advancement through evangelism and the planting of new congregations. If every ministerial committed to partnering together to plant a new church every five years we would make significant gains in church planting. Please join me in praying towards those ends.

We are thankful for our new church plant in Urbana-Champaign. The Grove is being planted by Josh Loomis. The church plant is blessed by a number of young families with kids. Below are the current new congregations (church plants and campuses) in the Great Lakes District for the past five years. Please join us in prayer for these new works and consider partnering with them in some way.

We ask for your continued prayers and partnership as we enter into a season of rebuilding. We are firmly committed to gospel advancement and see the planting of new congregations an integral part of our mission. Thank you for your partnership and prayers.

REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMISSION

Bob Blahnik

The financial position of the GLD is strong and well positioned for future ministry. This year, member churches have contributed \$247,379 to the ministry fund through June 30th which is an increase in giving of \$12,010 compared to 2024. Year to date giving from member churches is 6.4% ahead of budget through June 30, 2025. We are so thankful for this increased giving and the generosity of our member churches. The giving of member churches is the primary ongoing source of funding for GLD ministry as we seek to advance the mission of the EFCA by multiplying transformational churches among all people. Contributions from churches comprise 97% of the Ministry Fund's revenues of \$254,680 through June 30th.

We anticipate receiving funding from our partnership agreement with Brotherhood Mutual later this year, which will help further strengthen our financial position.

We strongly encourage each church to participate in Fair Share giving to support the GLD. Not all churches can give at the recommended 1.25% of their annual budget, however many churches increase the amount that they give each year with the goal of reaching 1.25% over a few years. The commitment by churches to support the GLD enables us to support every church regardless of different financial seasons that they may face.

Our biennial financial statement review from our external accountants was not ready to include in this online packet, but we hope to have it available as a handout at the conference.

The proposed 2026 budget continues to support the ministry of our Superintendent staff, Administrative Staff and other valuable team members. We are looking forward to relevant conferences as well as supporting churches with resources appropriate to their size, age and ministries.

As of June 30, 2025, the Ministry Fund Principal balance was \$195,414.

We have retitled the Church Planting Fund as the Advancement Fund. This fund will continue to be used for church planting as well as other Gospel advancing opportunities.

We continue to praise God for the faithfulness of our membership in supporting the GLD as it serves all of the churches within our geographic boundaries. FIT Moms – Families In Training – Serving single moms and their children

FIT Moms - Families In Training, an affiliate ministry of the GLD, seeks to provide support, education and advocacy for single moms and their children in the Waukegan, IL area. While helping the moms grow in the areas of Parenting Skills, Life Skills, and Anger Management, we also desire to see the children gain school readiness skills and encourage excellence. Our desire is that mothers and children will be introduced to and come to learn more of God's Redeeming Love.

In the fall of 2024, the moms returned to learning from Gary Chapman's "Anger – Taming a Powerful Emotion". We had used this book previously with some of these same moms. We were able to review some of the beginning of the book, revisit helping children handle their anger, and looking at a Biblical view of understanding and dealing with our own anger.

We were excited to have Colleen, a former class participant from 10+ years ago, join us as Mentor/Teacher, and Program Coordinator. It is wonderful to have someone who has lived much of the same journey, now be able to testify of how God's love has transformed her life.

We decided to spend one of the cold January 2025 nights enjoying a group favorite family bowling activity together. There were 19 who had a great time together. Then, moms began looking together at "Habits of the Household" where they read and discussed ideas for positive waking, mealtime, screentime, discipline, work and play, conversation, and bedtime habits.

The children's program continues with songs, movement, books read aloud, puzzles, games, and interactive play. Although the size of our space limits numbers, it also allows for the benefit of much needed personalized attention for each child.

After beginning with an event providing moms with time for creativity and encouragement, our summer once again included family time at an area Splash Park, and a late August picnic with family play.

Mission and Structure of the Organization

New Moms' mission is to strengthen families by partnering with young moms as they progress toward housing stability, economic mobility, & family well-being. We have served young moms and their children who are experiencing poverty & homelessness in Chicagoland, since our 1983 inception.

2025 Highlights - New Moms

- This year, we've built out more services within our Mental Wellness offerings. We've hired a third therapist—we now have two therapists focused on young moms, and one focused on child-parent therapy. We're thrilled to offer services to families across all programs. We've also been able to add on-site medication management, in partnership with RUSH Hospital System. Medication management is a massive need for participants—having on-site service reduces the burden of accessing care; and reduces wait time—which can prevent mental health crises from emerging.
- During the past year, New Moms was selected as one of three nonprofits in Crain's 2024 Best Places to Work in Chicago—ranking #48 out of 100. And this year, we were selected as one of Chicago's 25 Best and Brightest Companies to Work For.
- In response to ongoing challenges young moms are facing around the Benefits Cliff*, we've adjusted our Job Training program. We've developed a Career Pathways model to improve young moms' earning potential—young moms select 1 of 4 career pathways (manufacturing, healthcare, IT, & customer service). During their 16 weeks in the Job Training program, moms complete additional training and certifications in their fields—allowing them to enter employment at higher wages. We partner with employers in each field, who offer additional learning, on-the-job credentialing, and/or externship opportunities. This has resulted in improved 12-month employment retention for young moms.
- We are about to conclude our 4-year pilot College Success program—pairing cash stipends with intensive coaching and social capital, to help young moms persist in and complete college degrees. We're proud to share that we've had 10 graduates with Associate degrees—9 of whom have gone on to enroll in Bachelor's programs.

*Benefits Cliff: When young moms increase their income, or accept additional hours, they hit thresholds for benefits eligibility—but when single moms lose family-sustaining benefits like childcare subsidies, they cannot continue in jobs.

Agency Progress

Fiscal Year 2025 outcomes include: 91% of young moms receiving 6+ months of parent coaching practiced positive parenting skills, as measured by the Life Skills Progression Scale. 43% decreased their levels of parental stress. 93% of families met key health outcomes around subsequent pregnancies, breastfeeding initiation, and child immunizations. 75 young moms secured permanent employment. 60% retained employment for 12+ months. 82% of young moms increased their educational levels while enrolled. 89% of families exited to stable housing; and 78% retained housing for 12+ months. 54% of participants reported an increase in their feelings of spirituality, belonging, and connecting.

Our Programs

Programs are delivered through an Executive Skills Coaching approach—each young mom is in the "driver's seat" at New Moms, determining her goals & dreams for her family. We are coaches, helping her achieve those goals. Programs include:

Economic mobility is key to lasting change.

Housing: transitional and permanent supportive housing, where young moms can choose to engage with a family coach and work toward personal goals. We provide center-based housing for 40 families in Chicago & 18 families in Oak Park. Serves ~78 families annually.

Family Support: prenatal education, doulas, home visits, peer support groups, and other parenting resources, tools, and meaningful social connections. Serves ~220 families annually.

Job Training: individualized career planning; education re-enrollment support; 16 weeks of paid training and transitional jobs at our social enterprise candle company, Bright Endeavors; and permanent employment placement assistance. Serves ~100 young moms annually.

All families are also eligible for additional benefits, including formal mental health services; monthly "essential supply kits" including formula, diapers, wipes, and hygiene items; and financial and academic coaching.

In addition to our direct services, we also believe in sharing what we've learned. Through our social enterprise consultancy, Bright Path, we train and consult with peer organizations, foundations, and social enterprises nationally using our Executive Skills Coaching strategies and best practices, to create equitydriven change.

What is a Pastoral Training Church (PTC)?

Partner with TEDS to Raise the Next Generation of Gospel-Centered Leaders

A New Era of Theological Training Rooted in the Church. In a season of change and opportunity, one truth remains constant: the Church needs more faithful, equipped, gospel-centered leaders. Not in the distant future—but now. At Trinity Evangelical Divinity School (TEDS)—now aligned with Trinity Western University—we're answering this call by inviting local churches to become Pastoral Training Churches (PTCs). These are churches that don't just send students to seminary. They become the seminary—equipping the next generation of pastors and ministry leaders within the life and mission of the local church.

What Is a Pastoral Training Church?

A Pastoral Training Church (PTC) is a congregation that partners with TEDS to serve as a contextual training ground for future ministry leaders. These churches:

- Host a cohort of students enrolled in TEDS certificate or degree programs, using a church-based theological education model;
- Provide mentoring and ministry experiences that integrate classroom learning with real-life pastoral practice;
- Form a learning community where students are shaped theologically, spiritually, and relationally in the rhythms of the local church;
- Invest strategically in training and launching gospel-centered leaders—right from their own congregation or from the broader body of Christ.

Why It Matters

- 1. **A Shared Sense of Need:** Churches across traditions agree the pipeline for healthy, theologically trained leaders is thinning. Many pastors are nearing retirement. Emerging leaders are eager—but often under-equipped or unable to leave their ministry setting to pursue formal training.
- 2. **The Centrality of the Church:** The future of seminary education must be ecclesial—not just accessible, but rooted in the local church, shaped by mentoring relationships, and immersed in lived ministry. PTCs re-center the church as the primary context of theological formation.
